The Youth Services program engages eligible young people between the ages of 18 and 24 who have graduated or dropped out of high school and face barriers to employment (homelessness, poverty, disabilities, etc.).

The program helps young adults bridge the gaps by providing valuable education, training, counseling and work-based learning opportunities to achieve success.
